

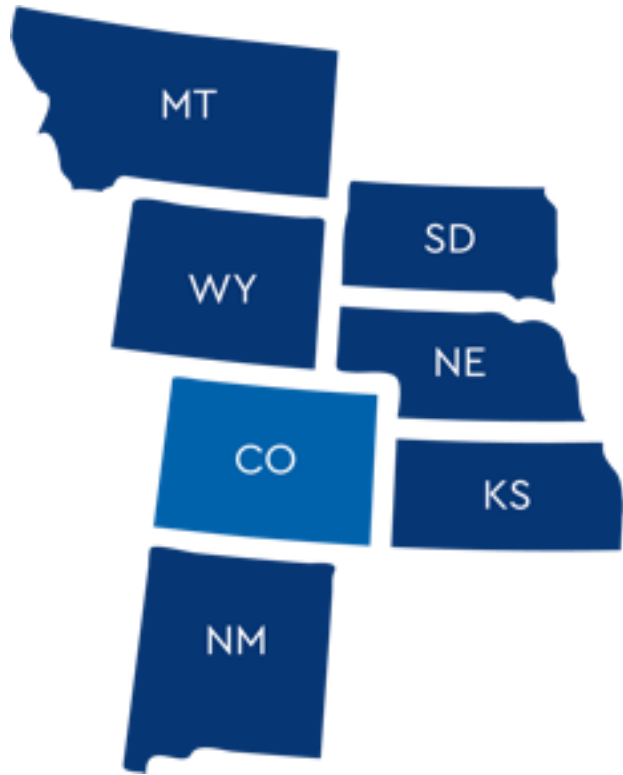

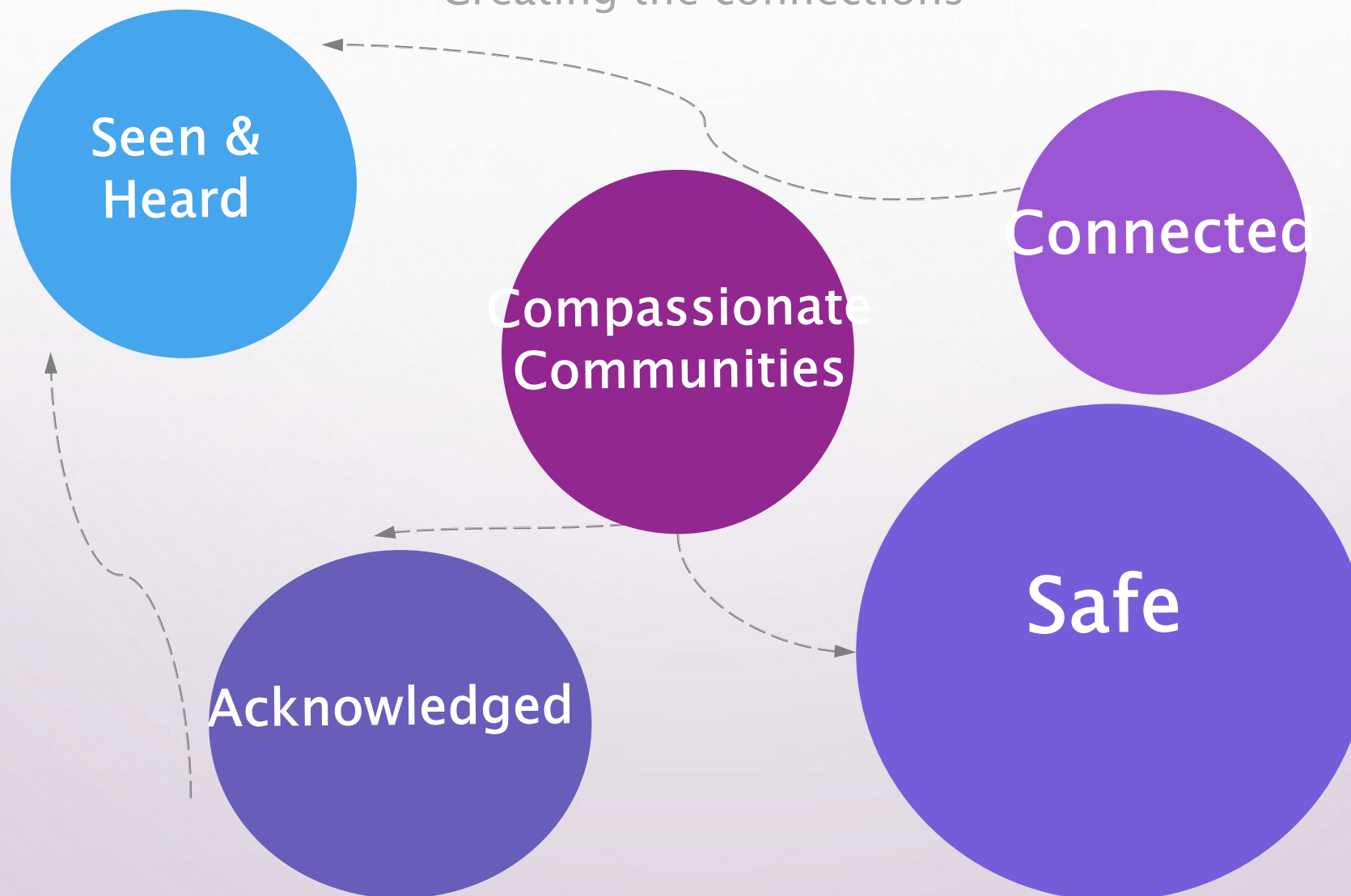

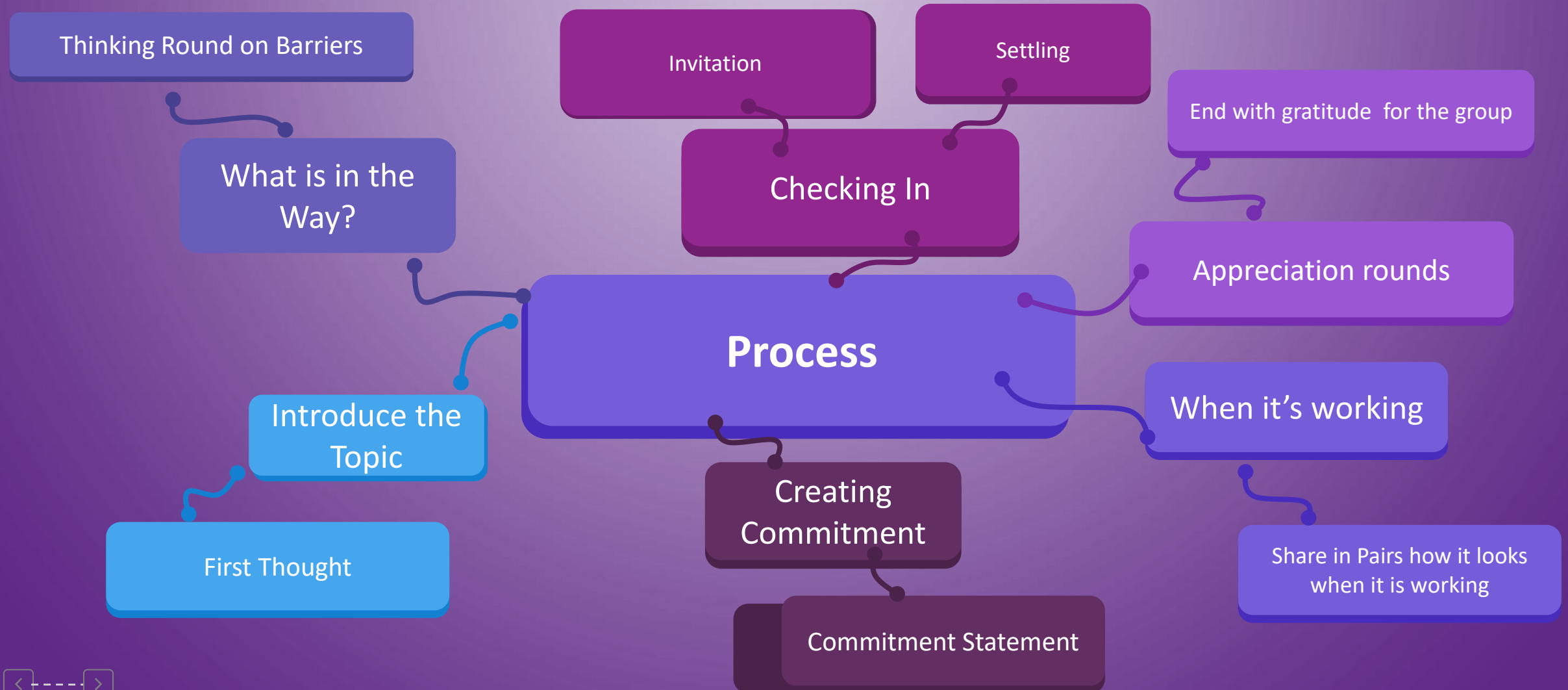

Do you want to learn tools to practice from an ethical and philosophical foundation?

Caritas Circle is a deeper dive into Jean Watson's theory of Caring Science. Together we will learn to use heart-centered awareness to create healing environments for self and others. - ◊ Practices towards Peace

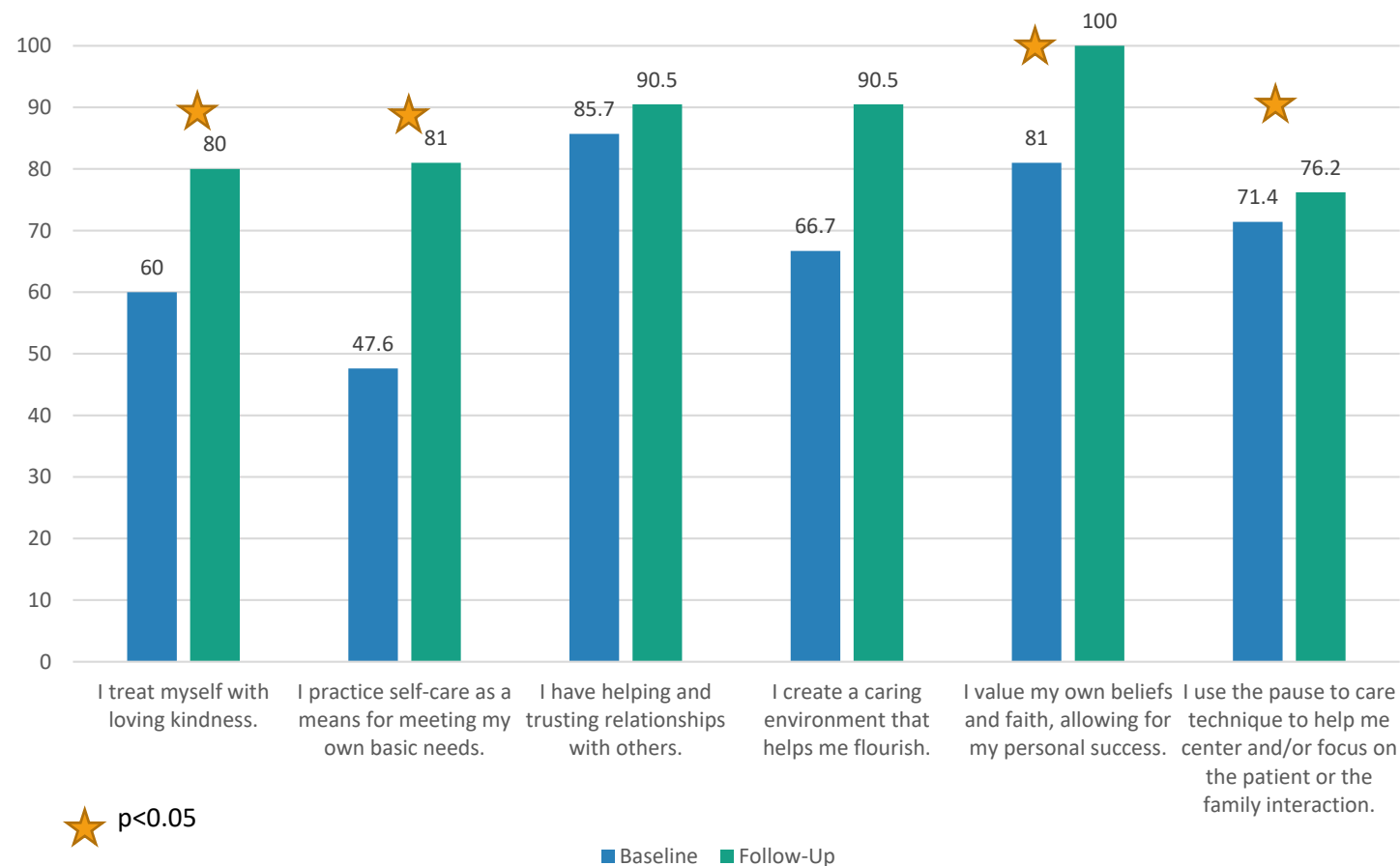

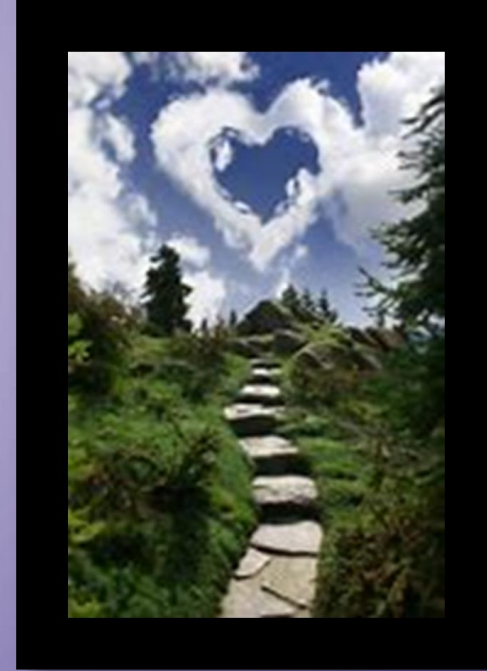

Test were Wilcoxon rank sum tests (non-parametrical that do not assume any distribution of the data such a t-tests and account for the ordinal response scale. P-value refer to analyses using the original 7-point scale, the collapsed scale is used to simplify the visualization.

New Graduate Compassion Circles

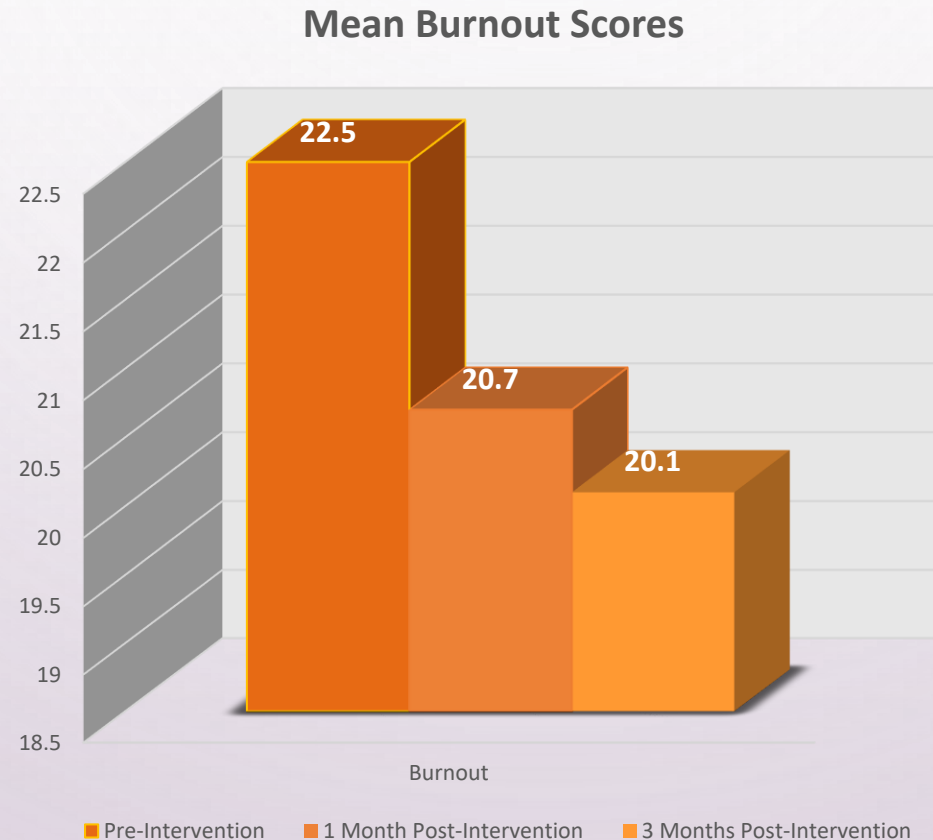


- ≈ One Year Residency Program

COMPASSION FATIGUE INTERVENTION FOR NEW GRADUATE NURSES

Intervention significantly improves compassion satisfaction, lowers burnout, and decreases secondary traumatic stress.

- 27% OF PARTICIPANTS HAVE DECREASED SECONDARY TRAUMATIC STRESS SCORES ONE MONTH POST INTERVENTION.
- 34.2% HAVE IMPROVED BURN OUT SCORES ONE AND THREE MONTH POST INTERVENTION.
- 88.1% FEEL PROUD OF THEIR WORK AS A NURSE.
- 79.4% OF PARTICIPANTS SATISFIED WITH THEIR WORK.
